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This special edition of the newsletter provides information about the Annual IAMS LIC Conference, 10-14 October, 2005 in Rome, Italy. The deadline for abstracts for all contributed papers and posters must be received by the conference Program Committee by **April 15, 2005**.

We also want to remind members and other people considering attending the conference of the need to make your **travel and accommodation bookings as soon as possible** because the conference is being held during the peak tourism season.

CALL FOR PAPERS

This is a call for the submission of proposals and abstracts for papers, posters and thematic panel discussions for the 2005 IAMS LIC Annual Conference.

This year the 31st Annual Conference of the International Association of Marine and Aquatic Science Libraries and Information Centres (IAMS LIC) will be held in cooperation with the Fisheries Department, Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations in Rome (Italy).

The Conference will discuss the information required in support of responsible fisheries, with all of the complexity that this entails. Sessions will cover the creation, use, and understanding of innovative information management techniques and technology.

The Conference will explore the role of libraries as mediators in providing access to the complexity of information required and the opportunities and challenges for securing access over the long term. Navigating the issues of Open Access and the intricacies of Open Archives requires new skills as well as stronger collaboration between libraries.

All potential conference attendees are encouraged to submit proposals including an abstract (required) of 150 - 200 words. (see Requirements and Guidelines for Abstracts below).

"Responsible Fisheries need Libraries as Mediators" is the 'teaser' of our conference. Herein one may discover three sub-themes:

* Fisheries

- FAO Code of Conduct for Responsible Fisheries
- Libraries of Fisheries Institutions and Organizations
- Information Networks supporting Fisheries Research

* Library Tools and Services

- Tools that help implement and promote open access and OAI
- Services that promote and enhance mediation
 - Advanced techniques that improve information retrieval

* Libraries as Mediators

- Libraries as mediators between publishers and users
- The Open Access Movement - new tasks for libraries (e.g. building of institutional repositories)
- Librarians as mediators between users, patrons, clients - IAMSLIC as a mediator between libraries from developed and developing countries.

- * Program limitations may require some individuals submitting requests for an oral paper to present posters; the program committee will notify such persons as soon as possible.
- * Time restraints may cause some papers or posters to be rejected, though these authors are strongly encouraged to attend the conference, as discussions and friendship-building among attendees are highly valued.
- * Contributed oral papers will be accorded a time slot of 20 minutes, plus 5 minutes for discussion.
- * A separate time and space has been assigned for poster presentations to give all attendees the possibility to look at the presented posters and communicate with the authors.
- * Authors of poster exhibits will be supplied with detailed instructions upon acceptance of their abstract.
- * To be included in the final program, presenters must register for the conference.

VISAS

It is not too early to start and think about visa requirements for those of you attending the IAMSLIC 2005 Conference in Rome. The procedures everywhere have become more complicated.

VISA REQUIREMENTS

VISA – GENERAL INFORMATION (Last Modified January 2005)

European Union citizens do not need visas for any Schengen country. Fifteen countries make up the Schengen area: Austria, Belgium, Denmark, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Iceland, Italy, Luxemburg, Netherlands, Norway, Portugal, Spain, Sweden.

Citizens of the following countries DO NOT require visas when visiting Schengen area countries for tourism, official or business stays of 90 days or less. {Nevertheless, within eight days from their arrival in Italy, all visitors must report to the local police authority (Questura) to obtain a residence permit (permesso di soggiorno)}:

ANDORRA, ARGENTINA, AUSTRALIA, BOLIVIA, BRAZIL, BRUNEI, BULGARIA, CANADA, CHILE, COSTA RICA, CROATIA, CYPRUS, CZECH REPUBLIC, EL SALVADOR, ESTONIA, GUATEMALA, HONDURAS, HUNGARY, ISRAEL, JAPAN, LATVIA, LIECHTENSTEIN, LITHUANIA, MALAYSIA, MALTA, MEXICO, MONACO, NEW ZEALAND, NICARAGUA, PANAMA, PARAGUAY, POLAND, RUMANIA, SAN MARINO, SINGAPORE, SLOVAKIA, SLOVENIA, SOUTH KOREA, SWITZERLAND, UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, URUGUAY, VATICAN CITY, VENEZUELA."

GRANT PROPOSAL GUIDELINES FOR REGISTRATION WAIVERS AND TRAVEL GRANTS

CATEGORIES AND DEADLINES

IAMSLIC grants are awarded in two separate cycles:
Grant Cycle Two -- Proposals for registration waivers and travel grants for the 2005 conference in Rome, Italy will be accepted during this grant cycle. **Deadline for travel grant proposals is Spring 2005 with the exact date to be announced with the call for proposals.**

GRANT PROPOSAL GUIDELINES

1. Eligibility. IAMSLIC grants are available only to the Association's Regional Groups, for projects in which the Principal Investigator is a current IAMSLIC member, or to IAMSLIC members seeking support to attend the Annual Conference.

2. Proposal. The entire grant proposal should be **two pages** including the required components outlined below.

Association Goals

The purpose of IAMSLIC is to provide an association for individuals and organizations with an interest in library and information science, especially as it applies to the recording, retrieval and dissemination of knowledge and information in all aspects of aquatic and marine science and their allied disciplines. The Association is supportive of efforts to enhance the ability of developing countries to create, access, and share information.

As funds are available, IAMSLIC will support projects related to its purpose through small grants (generally \$200-\$2000) to its Regional Groups and members. Projects should address a clear need related to the

above mission statement and should involve partnerships at various levels. Regional Groups may submit proposals in support of regional meetings or conferences. In Grant Cycle Two, IAMSLIC members may submit proposals for travel support to attend the Annual Conference to present a paper or poster session or to contribute to the conference in another role.

Grant Cycle

February/March: Announcement of the availability of Cycle Two travel grants will be posted to the mailing list and announced in newsletter.

24 May: Completed travel grant proposals will be submitted to the IAMSLIC Secretary, preferably in electronic form. The Secretary will forward all

proposals to the senior President-Elect, who will review the grant proposals in conjunction with the Conference Committee and will select individuals for funding. Recipients will be notified by the President-Elect as soon as possible after 31 May.

September/October: Grant recipients will present a project summary or progress report at the Annual Conference. This report may be done in person or submitted to the Secretary to be read at one of the general business meetings.

October: At or immediately following the Annual Conference, the Executive Board will review the Association's budget to determine if sufficient surplus funds are available to instigate a granting cycle and, if so, will determine how much will be made available.


