Congratulations (and the \$50 prize) go to Heidi Richards in the Physical Oceanography Department for submitting the winning name for the Institution's new research submarine, the COLUMBUS. Her entry, one of many reviewed by the selection committee, calls up visions of the discoverer of the New World and links those visions, most appropriately, to one of the most outstanding oceanographers of all time, Dr. Columbus O'D. Iselin, former Director of the Institution and Henry Bryant Bigelow Oceanographer. Our thanks to all who took part in the contest, and I know everyone joins me in congratulating Mrs. Richards."

Memberships are \$5 for the season, payable to the Business Office, Mr. Rudden. No person may use the boat unless he is a member of the Sailing Club.

In order to skipper the boat, members must have a basic knowledge of sailing technique. All sailors who have not skippered before and all newcomers to WHOI must demonstrate such knowledge and can receive help if needed.
